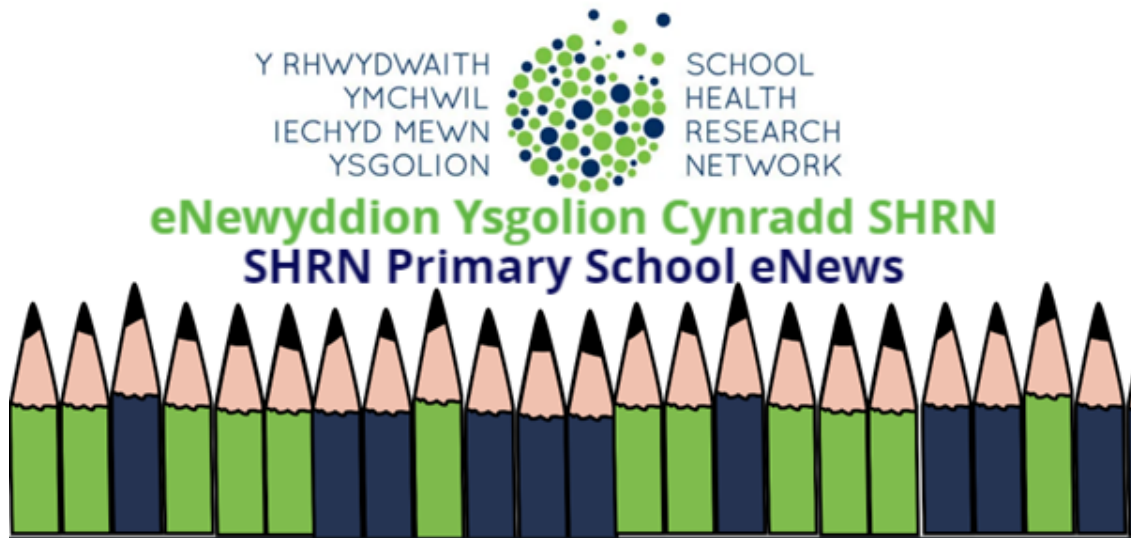


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Croeso i eNewyddion Ysgolion Cynradd SHRN am Mehefin 2024

1. Cofrestru ar gyfer casgliad data hydref 2024 mewn ysgolion cynradd y Rhwydwaith Ymchwil Iechyd mewn Ysgolion

1. Register for The School Health Research Network's 2024 autumn data collection in primary schools

On 17 June 2024, we will be inviting all primary schools in Wales to take part in The SHRN Student Health and Well-being survey and The SHRN School Environment Questionnaire (SEQ). They will join the 100% of maintained secondary schools already recruited to our network.

The SHRN 2024 data collection timeline:

17 June – 19 July 2024

Primary Schools register to become a SHRN member and sign-up to The SHRN Student Health and Well-being Survey and The SHRN School Environment Questionnaire (SEQ).

16 September - 20 December 2024

SHRN 2024 data collection for registered primary schools.

5. Changes and challenges: How are teachers experiencing wellbeing in schools?

In 2023, as part of their 2022-26 evaluation of [Framework embedding a whole-school approach to emotional and mental wellbeing](#), DECIPHer researchers working in the [Wolfson Centre for Young People's Mental Health](#) asked teachers about wellbeing in schools.

Researchers spoke with pupils and asked them to create posters around the topic of feeling 'safe' in their schools. The posters were published in February 2024 and can be viewed here:

Next on the list were interviews with teachers. In 2023, researchers interviewed 36 primary and secondary school staff and asked them how pupil wellbeing needs had changed since Covid. While most pupils were functioning well, there were some clear challenges.
