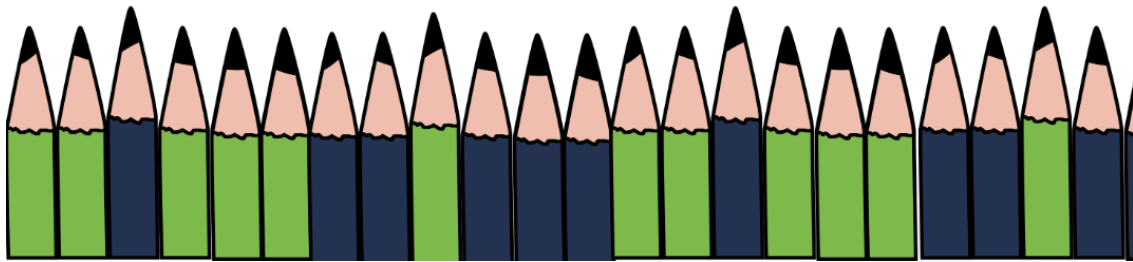

1. Recriwtio ysgolion cynradd i Arolygon Ymchwil Iechyd 2024 y Rhwydwaith

3. Dyddiad lansio arddangos data ysgolion uwchradd agrededig y Rhwydwaith 2023 ar Ddangosfwrdd Data'r Rhwydwaith Iechyd Cyhoeddus Cymru

Mae Iechyd Cyhoeddus Cymru yn falch o gyhoeddi y bydd data agrededig y Rhwydwaith o Arolwg Iechyd a Lles Myfyrwyr 2023 ar gael ar eu dangosfwrdd cyhoeddus ym mis Medi 2024.

'Nod y dangosfwrdd hwn yw caniatáu mynediad haws at ddata'r rhwydwaith sydd ar gael, a dealltwriaeth haws ohono, gan gynnig golwg fanwl ar y cwestiynau a ofynnwyd i holl fyfyrwyr ysgol uwchradd yn arolwg 2023. Gall defnyddwyr y dangosfwrdd gymharu'r canlyniadau gydag amser, gan ddarparu dealltwriaeth hydredol o'r ffordd y gall canrannau fod wedi newid dros y blynyddoedd.

1. SHRN 2024 Data collection: primary school recruitment update

From mid-June 2024, we will be inviting all primary schools in Wales to take part in The SHRN Student Health and Well-being survey and The SHRN School Environment Questionnaire (SEQ). They will join the 100% of maintained secondary schools already recruited to our network and enable us to provide evidence-based opportunities for joined up working across childhood and adolescence, and transition to secondary school.

The data collection timeline:

Mid June to 19 July 2024

Primary Schools register to take part in The SHRN Student Health and Well-being Survey and The SHRN School Environment Questionnaire (SEQ).

16 September – 22 December 2024

Data collection for registered primary schools.

We would be grateful for your support in promoting SHRN to your feeder primary schools by forwarding on these details and also sharing your experiences of using SHRN data.

3. Launch date for 2023 SHRN aggregated secondary school data to be displayed on the Public Health Wales SHRN Data Dashboard

Public Health Wales are pleased to announce that aggregated SHRN data from the 2023 Student Health and Well-being Survey in secondary schools will be available on their interactive and publicly accessible dashboard in September 2024.

The dashboard contains 32 different topics at local authority, health board and national levels, for each year of the survey (2017, 2019, and 2021) with views available for gender, age, family affluence and different geographic levels. View the dashboard [here](#).

Zoe Strawbridge, Advanced Public Health Intelligence Analyst, Public Health Wales said:

'This dashboard aims to allow easier access to, and understanding of, the available SHRN data providing a detailed view of the questions that were asked of all secondary school students in the 2023 survey. Dashboard users can compare the results over time, providing a longitudinal understanding of how percentages may have changed over the years.'

'We look forward to working with SHRN in the future to continue to develop products, share data and knowledge, and build strong networks between our organisations. In working together, we can provide knowledge and evidence to support policy and legislation for change, towards the future health and wellbeing of children and young people in Wales.'

4. Will you share your school cluster transition plans with DECIPHer?

Researchers at DECIPHer, Cardiff University are beginning a project to understand the common themes and priorities across school transition plans from different school clusters. This will help us to better understand how schools are supporting young people as they move from primary to secondary school.

All plans will be anonymised prior to analysis, and the project has been approved by the University Research Ethics committee.
